Who is the father of Joseph Taylor Sr.? Gayle Hix finds another candidate

If you have been studying our Taylor Association's database, you recall that we don't officially accept the parentage of Joseph Taylor Sr., husband of Nancy \_\_\_\_\_, as proven. Several theories exist. The one with ties to Zachary Taylor has been debunked. (Sorry about that.) The theory that Joseph descends from three generations of Richards has a lot of support, but is nevertheless circumstantial. (See http://www.taylorassociation.com for the Thorndale Reports.) The second edition of the Taylor family history book being prepared by Shari Franke has much additional detail about the Taylor's but doesn't endorse any candidates for the position of missing ancestor. She deals with the history that's known to be connected.

If you've been a subscriber to our newsletter you are aware that we have a Taylor Clearing House where questions about Joseph and other early North Carolina and Virginia Taylors are being studied. Our leading researcher for the project is Gayle Dean Hix, CLS. He is presently going through materials from Ancestral Research Center, the company who hired William Thorndale, A.G., C.G. to do the 1978 research commissioned by the Taylor family organization as it existed then. We have posted the reports on the Web, but Gayle has been studying:

180 pages on North Carolina Taylor families

He lists 38 sources where the citations came from.

110 pages on Norfold County, Virginia Taylor families

There are 51 sources on this list

Seven pages on Hardy families in London (part of the lineage of the 3 Richards)

Eight sources are given here

26 pages of notes made at the NC division of Archives & Historian, Raleigh.

26 sources are listed here

Then he states that Sections A and B of the research notes have still not been found in the boxes of Thorndale papers given to our present Taylor Association. [Does anyone know where these are?]

The ARC company suggested further research in all VA and NC counties enclosed in a 90-mile circle drawn from the mouth of the Roanoke Rived in Mecklenburg county, VA. They also recommended that the data be put on the back of family group records to facilitate analysis of the vast collection of data. Gayle says the recommendations were apparently never followed for two reasons [summarized here by TT editor]: The Taylor organization had other questions, involving Kentucky, Nauvoo, London, and the Zachary Taylor "bogey."

They ran out of time and money. The project was over budget. [Some six thousand dollars had been spent.]

## Will of Edward Taylor

In The Name of God Amen. I Edward Taylor of the Isle of Wight County being very sick & weak in Body Yet of a sound Mind and perfect Memory do make this my last Will and Testament. First I commit my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to be buried in a Christian manner and the rest of my Estate as followeth. Item, I Give unto my Son Joseph Taylor my Plantation and all the Land belonging to it, to him and his Heirs lawfully begotten of his Body and if such Heirs fail to return to my Son Edward and his heirs lawfully begotten of his Body and if such Heirs fail to return to my Son George and his Heirs forever. Item, I Give to my loving Wife Mary Taylor liberty of my Plantation, Horses and Land during her Widow Life. Item, I Give to my Son Edward my Gun and a 2 Year Old Heifer and her Increase. Item, I Give to my Son George, one Year Old Heifer and her Increase and my Sword I give to my Son George. Item, I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth, a Three Year Old Cow and Cows' Calf and their Increase. Item: I Give all the remainder part of my Estate to my loving wife Mary Taylor who I do Appoint my whole Executor to see this my Will done and performed. As Witness my Hand and Seal this Twenty Ninth day of June 1734.

The Taylor research project in 1978 was handled by a Salt Lake City firm named Ancestral Research Center, Inc. The professional genealogist assigned to the Taylor project was William Thorndale who has the credentials of both AG and CG. He authored and co-authored several genealogy books. He was and still is a good genealogical researcher and writer. He personally told me that clients like lots of data and lots of reports. The Taylor family got lots of both.

The ARC is no longer in business, but it's high time that someone analyzed the data and the reports supplied by the company.

Sections A and B of the research notes still have not been found.

The research notes were handwritten extracts of this multitude of records. They represent several weeks of work just to extract. Analysis of the information that was extracted represents several more weeks of work by the researcher.

Searching of records was limited in several instances due to pre-conceived restrictions on the project. It appears that records were being searched right up to the day the final report was being written.

A preliminary report was written by ARC, Inc 22 March 1977 outlining their recommendations for further research covering every VA and NC county enclosed in a 90 mile circle drawn from the mouth of the Roanoke River in Mecklenburg county, VA. The next ARC recommendation was to put the data on the back of family group records to facilitate analysis of such a vast collection of data.

Note: These two recommendations were apparently never followed for two major reasons:

- The Taylor organization kept asking questions that side tracked the main 1. issue of the project to fin the ancestry of Joseph Taylor Sr. Sidetracks reported in subsequent reports included:
  - A. Proof that the KY Taylor's came from NC
  - B. Study the proxy baptisms done in Nauvoo
  - C. A letter from John Harding in London
  - D. Other Taylor families in KY
  - E. Resurrecting the Zachary Taylor bogey
- 2. They simply ran out of time and money.

Interim reports were issued by ARC, Inc. on 27 April 1977, 18 Oct 1977, 26 Oct 1977, 25 Jan 1978, 1 Mar 1978, 31 May 1978, 14 July 1978, 4 Sep 1978, 22 Sep 1978.

By October 1977 the circle of interest had shrunk to a smaller circle drawn at the head of the Chowan River. They still recommended putting the data on the back of family group records. The ARC, Inc. had run out of time and far overspent the hours budgeted for the project.

The final report was issued 22 Nov 1978. The following questions are raised:

- 1. Was the research objective clear to both ARC, Inc. and the Taylor family?
- 2. Did ARC, Inc. have a definite research plan?
- 3. Was information withheld from ARC, Inc. or was misleading information given to them?
- 4. Were sidetracks given and taken?
- 5. Did ARC, Inc. fully implement their research plan?
- 6. Did ARC, Inc. find the correct ancestry of Joseph Taylor, Sr.?

The answers to these questions should be of interest to all Taylor descendants.
